
Big Apple Harvestime 2023 Venue Map

1. Woodredding Farm (GR SO640298) (///lookout.steadily.handfuls)

10.30am – 5pm Low volume, award-winning maker of cider and perry made in the traditional way. See how a small-scale cider maker can use both old and new technology and get tips on how to make your own cider. Walk around our traditional cider orchard and our perry pear orchard in sight of May Hill (said to be essential for good perry!). Draught and bottled cider and perry for sale with free tastings to help make your choice. Sausage baps, tea, coffee and soft drinks available

2. Lyne Down Organics (GR SO646312) (HR8 2NT) (///vented.overhaul.redeeming)

10am – 6pm (11.30pm on Saturday)Explore the orchard and hedgerows, meet the donkeys and Ryeland sheep and soak up the breathtaking views of May Hill and the Malverns. Cider tastings and pressings throughout the weekend. Visit our bar in the barn to enjoy a glass (or two). Plenty of hot and cold food options, cake and real coffee or bring a picnic. Celebrate Harvestime on Saturday evening with a special performance by Blackthorn Ritualistic Folk and an evening of toe tapping music from The Cherrystones. Bar open till late.

3. Avenue Cottage (GR SO649321) (HR8 2NU) (///remarking.device.heats)

11am – 5pm. Cottage perrymaking, fruit pressing, single variety perry for sale. An abundance of fruit and nut trees and hedges of edible berries in our replanted orchards. Bring a picnic to our meadow overlooking the panoramic view to the Malvern Hills and beyond. Apple refreshments and all donations in aid of 1st Much Marcle Guides.

4. Westons Cider (GR SO649331)(HR8 2NQ) (///strapped.hacksaw.kidney)

Shop and Scrumpy House Restaurant open with special site-only offers. Guided Mill Tours at 11am, 12.30pm, 2pm and 3.30pm (+5pm Saturday only). Book in advance on 01531 660 108 to avoid disappointment on the day. Play area open. 5. Much Marcle Memorial Hall (GR SO658330) (///engine.quietly.soggy)

11am - 5pm Serving hot drinks, soup and roll lunches and apple teas. Produce stall.

6. St Bartholomew's Church (GR SO657327) (///blaze.develops.masts)

10.30am – 5pm Church open for visitors all weekend. After three years of fundraising and repairs, the Bell Tower will once again be open to visitors. Exhibition of the work needed to repair the rotten beam above the bells, at considerable expense! Display of textiles by Hilary Underwood.

7. Hellens (GR SO661332) (///copies.quote.regularly)

11am – 5pm Entry to Hellens site £2.50 (children free). A Feast of Apples - displays of apples, cider fruit and perry pears; tastings of dessert and culinary fruit. Sales of less usual varieties of apples, apple juice and cider, apple trees (Saturday); Tools for Self Reliance Cymru; Herefordshire Wildlife Trust; Herefordshire Beekeepers. The National Fruit Show Education Team will be tickling taste buds with an apple challenge (including not only apples but other products made with fruit), amazing with apple facts and inspiring everyone to try five a day the British way. Explore the gardens. Tours of Hellens Tudor Manor house. Refreshments available.

8. Awnells Farm (GR SO658319) (HR8 2NW) (surfacing.crackling.situated)

10.30am – 5pm Walk through the ancient cider and perry pear orchards. Meet our closed herd of traditional Hereford cattle dating back 170 years, together with Golden Guernsey goats, Shetland sheep and a Shetland pony. Display of working stationary engines, vintage carts and vehicles and old farm tools. Explore the Midlands Air Ambulance Charity helipod. Charity stalls from Delilah's Umbrella and Hope Support Services. Jolly G's ice cream made fresh on the farm and Hereford beef burgers from Awnells' home herd will be available. Competition to guess the weight of Jock the Gentle Giant!

9. Gregg's Pit (GR SO662323) (HR8 2NL) (///plotting.mainframe.twinge)

10.30am – 6pm Craft cider and perry making in a traditional orchard. Meet the makers, their standard trees and vintage fruit, watch the pressing, taste and buy sparkling/draught cider and perry. Enjoy a drink from the bar and ploughman's lunches by Truffles Delicatessen. A newly installed solar PV panel array on the Cider Shed roof with battery storage and inverter in the stillage room make a happy marriage of 21st and 18th century technology! No dogs in orchard please but may be exercised under owners' control in car park area.

Grid references are accurate to 100m. Postcodes are provided where navigation apps will take you near to the venue – typically within 200m. We have omitted postcodes where they do not take you close to the venue or provide misleading directions.
